

Can You Dance a Tobacco Hill?

This tune comes from Pikeville, Kentucky fiddler Owen "Snake" Chapman (1919 - 2003). He learned the tune from his father. I have not been able to find any explanation for the title. There does not appear to be a country dance called a "tobacco hill," the term appears to have been used to describe the slight mound of soil a tobacco farmer would build up when planting each seedling.
