



Learned from the playing of BHO member Bosco Takaki, who learned it from a recording of West Virginia fiddler Arnold Williamson. While the A part is similar to the tune Scruggs plays on his classic album Foggy Mountain Banjo, the B part is very different.

Note that there is an up the neck version of the A part, there is only one version of the B part in this setting. So when you get to the end of the up the neck A part, at measure 26, go back to the B part, which starts at measure 11.
