

That's My Rabbit, My Dog Caught It

This rare fiddle tune in the key of C was first recorded by the Walter Family of Richmond, Indiana, in March of 1933, by Champion Records, a local company that was a division of Gennett Records. The band included Draper Walter (1870- 955), fiddle; Mary Walter, piano; Ray Agee.banjo; Charlie Estes, guitar; Wilburn Burdette, washtub bass; and Charlie Burdette, jug.

Note that measures 22 and 30 feature a ghost hammer, where you hammer onto the 4th string at the 4th fret, without picking it first with the right hand. The preceding open "ghost" note, the note in parantheses is not played, it is there to make sure the hammer-on sounds in the MIDI playback. Since you are hammering onto a string that has not first been picked by the right hand, it is not already agitated, so you have to smack it pretty good with the left hand finger, to make sure that it sounds loud enough to be heard.
